Greg Miraglia is currently the dean of career technical and online education at Napa Valley College in California. He also teaches a variety of law enforcement courses, including all human relations, workplace harassment, community policing, and one of the only state certified hate crimes investigations courses in the State of California. He is the national program coordinator for the Stop the Hate! Program and speaks about hate crime prevention throughout the country. He is also a radio program host on Outbeat Radio, a weekly LGBT program on KRCB radio. Miraglia is a member of the Board of Directors for the Matthew Shepard Foundation headquartered in Denver and is an advisor for Positive Images in Santa Rosa, California. Miraglia has more than 30 years of experience in law enforcement with three different police departments, most recently as deputy chief of the Napa Valley Railroad Police Department. He holds both a master's degree in education administration and a bachelor's degree in business.

Shane Windmeyer is a leading national author on gay campus issues, leader in gay and lesbian civil rights, and one of the country's most tireless champions for LGBT issues on college campuses. Windmeyer is the founder and executive director of Campus Pride, the only national organization for student leaders and campus organizations working to create a safer college environment for LGBT students. He is well-known for his pioneering work with the Lambda 10 Project – National Clearinghouse for GLBT Fraternity and Sorority Issues. Windmeyer is the author of *The Advocate College Guide for LGBT Students*, the first-ever college guide profiling the "100 Best LGBT-Friendly Campuses." He is also the editor of *Brotherhood: Gay Life in College Fraternities* and co-editor of the books *Inspiration for LGBT Students & Allies*, *Out on Fraternity Row: Personal Accounts of Being Gay in a College Fraternity*, and *Secret Sisters: Stories of Being Lesbian & Bisexual in a College Sorority*. He holds a master's degree in higher education and a bachelor's degree in communications.
